



STUDENT DAY OF ACTION PALSOC ACTION GUIDE

Palestinians resisting apartheid need our solidarity more than ever, but our universities invest thousands of pounds every year in companies complicit in Israel's ongoing attacks. Student actions since 2023 have been incredibly powerful, and have mobilised huge numbers on campus to stand against our institutions' complicity in genocide.

In the context of Israel's ongoing violence against Palestinians, students across Britain are taking action to show that our voices will not be silenced: we will stand in solidarity with Palestinians in their struggle against apartheid and racism by campaigning for our universities to divest fully from companies complicit in Israel's ongoing genocide.

WHAT CAN WE DO?

We want to use this day of action to challenge our universities' complicity in Israeli apartheid and escalate our ongoing campaigns:

- If there isn't yet a divestment campaign on your campus, check out our [university complicity database](#), our [guide to organising an Apartheid Off Campus campaign](#), and host a planning meeting to kickstart your campaign ([get in touch](#) for tips and campaign trainings)
- If already have an active divestment campaign, use this opportunity to take action towards your goals: you could host a mass-email event to send emails to your vice chancellor lobbying for full divestment from complicit companies, write a piece in your student newspaper arguing for full divestment, launch a student petition demanding divestment from companies that support Israel's system of oppression, or take action to encourage students to [Boycott Barclays](#) (e.g. a stall/picket/flyering)
- You could organise a walk-out from classes (see resources [here](#)), calling on your fellow students to take direct action to highlight your institution's complicity.
- You could organise a rally on campus – make sure you get in touch with other groups (e.g. climate campaigners, anti-racist campaign groups, feminist groups or other supportive societies) to co-host; make sure you know your speakers in advance and have no tolerance for non-strategic statements (don't end up in the Daily Mail!), and make sure you [know your rights!](#)
- You could host a vigil on campus to mark the number of people murdered in Israel's massacre in Gaza – drawing attention to students or young people killed, or universities targeted, is a good way to think about making this especially resonant for your fellow students.
- You could invite a speaker (ideally platforming Palestinian voices) to talk about the importance of divestment from complicit companies (email stella.swain@palestinecampaign if you need help contacting a speaker)
- You could also do some more direct action, like banner drops or sit ins – make sure you're thinking tactically about these: how will they help you achieve the goals of divestment/your campaign goals? Do you have enough people to make them effective and safe? Do you know the risks, and how to avoid them? Are you making sure you're keeping people safe (e.g. not doing dangerous actions with people who have insecure immigration status)? Make sure you know [how to get in touch with ELSC](#) if anything goes wrong.

You can also show your solidarity on this day of action by:

- Putting up posters across campus ([download here](#), or order print copies by emailing us) – make sure you take a photo of them and tag [@palestinesolidarityuk](#) (Instagram) / [@pscupdates](#) (Twitter) so we can share them
- Making a banner (e.g. one that says ‘Apartheid off Campus’) and do a banner drop or tag us in a photo on social media (or send the photos to us and we’ll post them from our account!)
- Tweeting, making an Instagram post, Reel or TikTok including the hashtag #ApartheidOffCampus, tagging the Palestine Solidarity Campaign, and asking people to share it far and wide
- Getting in touch with PSC to discuss starting or developing a divestment campaign in your university – we can run workshops with you to map out successful campaigns, including motions to SUs, direct action, open letters and more!
