With Israeli Prime Minister Binyamin Netanyahu re-elected, the next move to entrench apartheid after the “Nation State” law, the siege of Gaza and slaughter of unarmed demonstrators for the Right of Return, may be Donald Trump’s still secret “Deal of the Century”, now expected in June.

But how are Palestinians themselves thinking about the future? After years of failed negotiations for a separate Palestinian state, the original demand of the Palestine Liberation Organisation (PLO) – One Democratic State – is back under discussion.

In a survey of Palestinian public opinion in March, in light of the

suspension of peace negotiations, 55% support popular non-violent resistance; 47% support a return to an armed intifada; 41% support dissolving the Palestinian Authority; and 31% support abandoning the two-state solution and demanding the establishment of one state for Palestinians and Israelis. What could “one state” mean? ►
